**Homily for Aug. 21, 2011 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 56:1-6, 7  
Romans 11:13-15, 32 Matthew 15:21-38**

**Dear People of St. Thomas More,**

**“Observe what is right. Do what is just.”**

**Isaiah is one of the great prophets who lived about 3000 years ago. Yet, his poetry and his moral insight have spoken to people for all these centuries. He lived in difficult times—was ravaged the country, his hometown, Jerusalem, was under siege—difficult times. Yet part of Isaiah’s greatness is that in a difficult, depressing situation, he remains a man of hope.**

**It is to people in difficult times that Isaiah says, “Observe what is right. Do what is just.” Speaking for God, he stresses a need to keep the Sabbath holy. Strange, one might think, associating the idea of observing what is right, doing justice and keeping the Lord’s day—**

**But have you ever heard the complaint— “acted before one thought?” Maybe “observing what is right...” first entails thinking about what is right on a regular basis— One day a week...I mean, I have a busy calendar—I could be doing something morning ‘til night and I suspect the same is true with all of you. You are busy—meeting yourselves coming and going some days. But you know we can make time if we put it on the calendar. Isaiah was talking about Saturday the Sabbath, but we can do it on the Lord’s day, Sunday.**

**We should plan to set Sunday aside for thinking about what God wants—what is right, just. If we don’t take time and reflect, we can be caught off guard by life’s demands—ever hear someone say “they acted without thinking?” We need planned time, scheduled time, for thinking before circumstances call us to act.**

**If we want a better world, maybe it would improve if there were more people willing to keep the 10 Commandments. Abe Lincoln once said that if opportunity and impulse came together, we might all be candidates for the hangman’s noose. If we stop and just reflect on the 10 Commandments and help others to—our daily news might have fewer murders, thieves—lies, conspiracies, coveting, perjuries etc. to report; our neighborhoods would be safer.**

**Lives practicing the 10 Commandments will be better, but those are only the foundation of a good life. Nowhere in the 10 Commandments is a command to be a good Samaritan. Loving God— think of the relationship between the words ‘God’ and ‘good’: in English—only an o difference. All goods come from God. All goods are God related. In our faith, God is the Creator and with Isaiah God has a love for His people, so God not only creates but loves—both words, create and love, are actions. If we are made in the likeness of God, then creativity and being loving ought to mark our lives. Inactivity is unacceptable. We were made like God so we are called to “greatness”. Greatness is reflectivity in action.**

**Did you ever know someone who was great who did nothing? Great people leave the world a better place; they’re a blessing to those they meet. Think of Abe Lincoln and others who were a blessing long after they were gone.**

## PREPARING FOR THE NEW TRANSLATION OF THE MASS

### Communion and the Concluding Rites

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of *The Roman Missal*. This week, we explore Communion and the Concluding Rites.

Our great prayer of praise and thanksgiving leads through the Lord's Prayer, our petition for daily bread, into the action of Communion. We sing together even as we rise and move forward in procession to the altar. We must move to receive Communion because the Eucharist is transformative—it demands action of us, internal as well as external. We do not receive the sacrament in silence, but with a dialogue that is a profession of faith: "The Body of Christ." "Amen." "The Blood of Christ." "Amen." Our "Amen" is also a prayer that we may become what we receive, the Body of Christ, living and active in the world. So it makes sense that after Communion we are dismissed—not just let out, but sent forth with a mission "to announce the gospel of the Lord." This leave-taking is joined to a blessing, a prayer for God's continuing protection as we go out on our way.
