Homily for November 20, 2011 Feast of Christ the King  
Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17, 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28, Matthew 25:31-46



Dear People of St. Thomas More,

Again I want to talk about the Mass—Eucharist—the word means to give thanks. Being thankful might be the healthiest way to live. Last week I talked about the Eucharistic Prayer—sometimes called the Canon. The Canon is from the Greek word for—measurement or standard—a standard for what the prayer should be. The measure is important because some people were saying Jesus didn't die—so the standard meant a level of belief. The Eucharistic prayer is a ritual meal that celebrates not only Jesus' suffering and death, but also his resurrection.

In this ritual meal, Jesus is connecting us to His sacrifice—His suffering, His death, and resurrection. The ritual meal has a long history in Judaism. The Passover meal was one of the ritual meals, connecting people every spring with the Exodus. The sacrifice at the Temple often included a meal—maybe for the immediate family, but often for a larger community. The ritual meal, the Passover meal—the Last Supper—communion, community, communication—come from a Latin word—to share. In this ritual, through communion, it forms community, and through communion the ritual meal can communicate to those who share it. Now Jesus, the Risen Lord, is the meal. Now if we are having a ritual meal, the Lord's Last Supper, it is forming a community, so we ought to think about who we are having the meal with. After the end of the Canon, the Eucharistic prayer, there is the Our Father.

The Our Father is from Matthew's gospel. We use the word Father and think about our own fathers, but one of the meanings of Father in this prayer is origin—source—like where a river starts. This God is the 'source' of all that exists, all that is alive. Now in Luke's Lord's Prayer, it simply starts with Father. The pronoun 'our' adds a dimension to our understanding, building on the idea that God is the source of all, especially all living. 'Our' implies a relationship with all other human beings, at least, even those who have gone before us (The Church talks about the 'communion of saints') and those not yet—those yet to come. In the original language, Aramaic, what Jesus spoke, the word Abba is used, and it is best translated as 'Dad' or 'Daddy,' so there should be a very personal, close relationship. This is who is giving us our 'daily bread.'

In English Bread usually means bread in some form or other, but in the original language 'Bread' could mean 'Food.' Give us what we need today. We like to think of ourselves as pretty self-sufficient. We like our independence and like to think we are fairly indestructible. My great-grandmother would say: "The old will die and the young sometimes do." Maybe with more realism we should think about asking for our daily bread, with a thought given to how fragile life is.

As the Communion rite moves on, we might think of the company we share with. In Jesus' day, the kings had meals with their men; it was often a select company. In English literature we have the same thing going on in the tales of King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table. By our communion, we are being called, invited, to join the company of Christ's Champions—heroes. By going to communions, we are acknowledging a call to greatness. Have you ever thought of joining St. Joan of Arc, or Mother Theresa of Calcutta, or St. Thomas More in the ultimate Champions' banquet? Yet isn't that what heaven is? Sharing in the Last Supper with Jesus the Risen Lord is not only sharing His suffering and death but also in His resurrection—the meal with God and His Champions that lasts forever.

The Dismissal Rite in ancient churches, the Catholic churches of the East and the Roman church of the West, is very brief. It's a closing prayer and a blessing; then we are expected to take God's Word, His message, into the world—we who received the Risen Lord are called to be other Christs in a world that does not know Him.

Today, this week, take some time and think about how you should use the Mass to become great—more Christ-like, more God-like.
