Homily for January 22, 2012, 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time  
Jonah 3:1-5, 10 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 Mark 1:14-20



Dear People of St. Thomas More,

**Black humor—doesn't mean Black American's humor—no, it means gallow's humor—seeing something funny in a bad situation. Recently I was watching a cartoon movie with a 3 year old about a mouse. A fox had invited the mouse to his house, promising to fix dinner. Being a cartoon, the mouse's thinking was pictured in a bubble—he was dinner—the 3 year old got the joke....maybe because he had seen it a number of times.**

**The book of Jonah is one of 12 minor prophets; there are 4 major prophets—16 total and of the 16, Jonah is unique. Jonah is not a collection of sermons or historical statements, but a comedy—black humor, written by someone other than Jonah.**

**To start off with, the name Jonah means Dove, and his father's name is "of faithfulness", so his full name, so to speak, is Dove of Faithfulness.**

**Anyway, the Dove of Faithfulness gets God's call to be a prophet—and is told to go east, to Nineveh, the capital of the most warlike empire of the ancient world—the almost Nazis of the time. No sooner has God finished speaking than the Dove of Faithfulness goes not east but west, to the port of Joppa, and hops a ship for further west—Gibraltar. The ship gets out to sea in the Mediterranean and a terrible storm hits the ship; all is on the verge of getting lost. When Jonah, still not wanting to go East, volunteers to the panicked crew that he is the reason for their danger—it's ok, toss him overboard. For him death in the depths was better than God's will for Nineveh. Well, the dove of Faithfulness no sooner hits the water when a huge fish, a whale of a fish, swallows him up and 3 days Dove is in the belly of the fish— cold and wet, you can imagine—after which the creature burps the Dove of Faithfulness up on shore, probably only slightly smelly for wear. But Dove's attitude has only softened a little bit.**

**Nineveh is a large city, much larger than any Jewish city of the time. We're told it takes 3 days to walk over it. With his attitude, the Dove of Faithfulness only walks in a day and he says only 5 words in Hebrew, 8 words in English: "In 40 days, and Nineveh shall be destroyed!" Miracle of miracles, the Ninevites repent from their greatest to the lowest. Now Dove is mad—God will forgive them. So what is the point? Like the gospel of Mark, Jesus calls people to repent—**

- 1) Repent—give up sin—the personal bad habit, the self destructive tendency we keep doing, that damages us and the people around us.**
- 2) It is never too late to repent—don't despair. God is a God of hope— one can always repent—change. To give up will lead to despair—hopelessness, and in almost 36 years of being a priest—tragedy happens when someone believes there is not hope of change—repentance.**

**Today, this week, let's see something humorous—as we seek to go in God's direction—peaceful as a nice dove.**

**Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
What do You Want?**

Jesus was starting to become very popular, at least with the ordinary people. They had seen how he had cured the sick and cast out demons. The gospel has one unusual sentence about those demons: Jesus did not let them speak "because they knew who he was." (Mk 1:34) Apparently, the demons would have identified him as the Son of God. Jesus knew the people would not understand this and try to proclaim him as their king. Jesus had no intention of living as a worldly king, in comfort and riches. In fact, he came to free people from needing wealth and power.



Popularity and wealth do not interest St. Paul, either. When he preaches the gospel, the good news of Christ's resurrection (and ours), he needs no other recompense. (1 Cor 9:18) All he wants is to share eternal life. He specifically refuses to be paid for his preaching, to show that he will be rewarded by Christ.

So what do you hope for; what is your goal in life? Do you only feel secure when you have saved enough money and invested it wisely? Do you need other people to make you happy? Or at least a few hundred Facebook friends? Or are you like Job in the first reading: having no hope of escaping a life of drudgery? He eventually found that only by trusting God can anyone be happy, even when things go wrong.

We can follow Paul's example of love for all people no matter who they are. Paul's love was not to make others like him. He genuinely wanted to bring the good news to them: by his love for them, Paul showed that God loves them even more. He knew the gospel requires a change of heart, so his love for others helped them to be more open to change. Let us ask the Lord to fill us with his love, so that we can help each other to hear the good news.

## Giving Tree

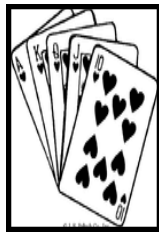
