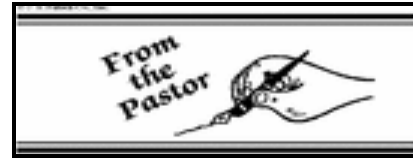

**Homily for January 15, 2012 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time  
1 Samuel 3:36-10:19 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20  
John 1:35-42**



**Dear People of St. Thomas More,**

**Today the readings talk about being called. The story of Samuel is about 3,000 years old. If you remember any of the earlier stories of Samuel, you will remember that Samuel's mother, Hannah, was barren for years and came every year to the Jewish shrine at Shiloh to pray; and she prayed for a son, since being childless in that society was seen as a curse. She promised God that if He granted her prayer, after weaning the baby at 3 years old, she would leave him at the shrine to become a high priest for God.**

**Samuel becomes one of the great men of the Old Testament. Today's passage speaks of Samuel's call, probably at a mid-to-late grade school age. He becomes the high priest of the shrine at Shiloh and a seer, capable of seeing the future; he also becomes a great prophet—telling the national community what God wanted them to hear. And lastly, he sometimes acted as King, even though he was not crowned. He was a king maker. Point we need to note is that God's call is a call to greatness, whether it be almost 3,000 years ago or today. It doesn't matter if it comes in the form of a voice in the middle of the night or in a burning bush—God calls people to greatness, independent of who their parents are.**

**In the gospel we hear "John's" version of the call of Andrew and Peter. Andrew is a follower of John the Baptism and hears him call Jesus the Lamb of God. So out of interest, Andrew follows Jesus and becomes a disciple. Andrew then talks to his brother, Simon (Peter) and tells him, "We have found the Messiah/Savior." And Simon (Peter) gets interested and follows Jesus and gets a nickname "Rock" "Peter".**

**Now understand, these are ordinary men, small businessmen, maybe unable to read or write—average people for the time. Christ calls average, ordinary people like you, like me. They were not perfect. The ancient Jews believed that our very existence is proof that God called us, from the womb. Hmmm-scary thought—God calling us, you, me, calling us to greatness—**

**Now in our society, that only thinks of "what is in it for me," God's call for greatness is a call to be loving of others, the community. Christ's call is to be of service. It's a call to be honest, to do what is right, morally right, just, kind. Answering God's call will make us great—outstanding individuals.**

**Today, this week, think about God's calling, the call to greatness.**

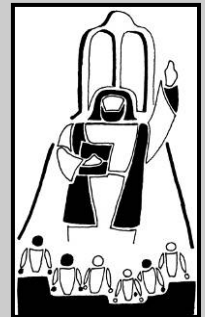


**Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**Thunderbolts and Lightning**

One of the most difficult duties of a disciple is to follow the command of Jesus to spread the gospel to all nations. (Lk 24:47, Mk 116:15, Mt 28:19) I think one reason may be that we don't feel we have the authority to tell someone else what to believe. Most of us don't think we know the gospel well enough to preach it. Or we are so afraid of offending atheists, that we use that fear as an excuse to say nothing. But being a disciple means following Jesus. The gospel this Sunday mentions twice that Jesus taught with more authority than any of religious leaders of Israel. So how can we get such authority?

First, Jesus didn't get his authority from winning a Messiah election. And he didn't threaten people with thunderbolts and lightning. He certainly didn't impress people by saying what they wanted to hear. He spoke the truth that he heard from his Father. His two main actions in his ministry were curing and forgiving people. Since the Jews thought sickness was a punishment for sins, by curing the sick and forgiving sins, Jesus showed that God loves even sinners. And those actions showed that Jesus got authority from his Father.

"But you still haven't answered the question: How do we get that authority?" We get it from the Holy Spirit, in Baptism and Confirmation. And like an athlete, who may be born with strength and abilities, yet has to work-out and practice to be any good, we still need to grow in that authority. One way is to read the scriptures and pray with them, so that we get to know God through his Word and begin to listen to him in our prayers. We can consciously decide to see God in other people, not just those we love, but everyone, even the ones who annoy us. (And especially the ones who challenge us to be more loving, patient and forgiving.) Most parishes have programs that encourage sharing your faith, such as RCIA, Christ Renews his Parish, etc. And of course, the Eucharist and other sacraments strengthen God's life in us. You'll know you have that authority when you can talk about your faith with confidence instead of hesitation, because you will be speaking from experience, not second hand knowledge.
