A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Homily for June 12, 2011 The Feast of Pentecost

Dear People of St. Thomas More,

As we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, it is sometimes difficult to picture the Spirit of God in our lives as we think of the Spirit as a dove or as tongues of flame that the Acts of the Apostles describes. So I want to use some Old Testament images of how the Spirit of God has moved in people's lives to give us some hints of how the Spirit might be working for us.

First, think of David, "the spirit of the Lord rushed on David" after Samuel anointed him. (1 Samuel 16:13) David is described as a "youth, handsome to behold," a young teenager. The spirit of God gives David courage to overcome Goliath. We think courage—that's good. But the Spirit is giving far more than just what we think of as courage for one moment. The Spirit of God prepared David to deal with the giant Goliath, the trained warrior, by giving the youth David the experience of having killed a lion and a bear. (1 Samuel 17:36) So the Spirit gave David experiences to support the courage and the confidence so he could do what God wanted. So look for what kind of experience God is giving you to see how the Spirit might be working.

Isaiah (11:2ff) tells us that where the Spirit of God is working, the Spirit will foster the growth of the gifts of wisdom, good counsel, respect/reverence of God, knowledge, and understanding in the individual in whom the Spirit is working. Now, the understanding means two different things: (first) it means knowing the facts; (second) it means being emotionally supporting.

It is customary for one of the readings of Pentecost to be the story of the tower of Babel. Strange? No. The Church wants to make a point about the Spirit of God. The tower of Babel is a temple without God. And the result is that the people of Babel lose the ability to understand (Genesis 11:7) In contrast, the apostles (in Acts 2:8-12) are enabled by the Spirit to be understood by people speaking different languages.

You see, the Spirit of God not only enriches individuals with gifts but also builds up the community of God. The result of this working of the Spirit will be seen as what Paul in Galatians (5:22ff) calls the fruits of the Spirit—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

Lastly, on this Feast of Pentecost, this week, as you think of how the Spirit might be working in your lives, remember the Old Testament prophet Joel. God spoke to him and said, "I will pour out my Spirit upon them. Your young men shall dream dreams and your old men shall see visions." (Joel 3:1-5)

We should understand that these dreams and visions are not idle fantasies, but possibilities, needed improvements, opportunities. If we see the Spirit moving in our lives, we can change the world.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

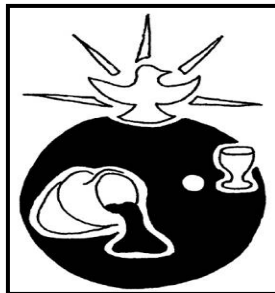
Soul Food

Why would Jesus wait till the night before he died to give us the gift of the Eucharist? He knew his disciples would have trouble accepting his death on the cross. He made the symbol of breaking the bread refer to his body being broken; the wine poured out was his blood to be shed. But he also did something new, as the first reading says, he gave them a "food unknown to your fathers." (Dt 8:16) He made the bread to be his Body, the wine to become his Blood. Just as he would really die, these sacraments were really his Body and Blood. He did this the night before his death to help them to see the connection.

Jesus' gift of the Eucharist was not just for the Last Supper. His command, "do this in remembrance of me" (Lk 22:19 and 1 Cor 11:24) meant that it should be done regularly. Because of this, we have Jesus so close to us that he lives in us; when we receive communion, we are receiving him into our lives. It reminds us that we are never alone, that the Lord is never very far from us.

Just as food and drink strengthen our bodies and keep us healthy, the Eucharist also strengthens our spirit. The disciples were familiar with the story of manna in the desert, how it kept the Israelites going when there was no other food. So the Body and Blood of Christ keep us strong in our faith if we receive them regularly. Remember how Jesus told his followers to take up their cross daily? (Mt 16:24 and Mk 8:34, etc) When we eat that Bread, we offer our body to be broken; when we drink his Blood, we offer ours to be poured out for Him.

If these were just symbolic, not the real presence of Christ, they might have some value as reminders. But they would lose the most important value: that this is God's action helping us, not our own faith or self-confidence. We can only do so much on our own. But with God's help and his life in us, we do whatever he asks of us.
