## ST. THOMAS MORE MINISTRIES, ORGANIZATIONS, ACTIVITIES AND COMMITTEES

Here's a brief look at what goes on at St. Thomas More. Please call the office at 831-4142 for more info.

**Administrative/Finance Committee**-assists in the oversight and responsible use of the financial and physical resources entrusted to the parish by the parish community. In addition, the committee assists the pastor and pastoral council in a consultative manner on matters regarding the financial administration of the parish.

**Adoration Chapel**-open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. All are welcome!

**Applefest Committee**-responsible for organizing and executing the largest social & fundraiser in the parish.

**Beggars for the Poor**-takes food and clothing downtown Indianapolis to the homeless.

**Bible Study**-provides members an opportunity to study the life of Jesus as presented in the Bible and other reading materials. Currently have Tuesday am, Wednesday am, and Thursday evenings (twice a month.)

**Christ Renews His Parish**-a renewal process for members of the parish to experience personal conversion and Christian community.

**CYO Sports**-wide range of athletics offered for various grades-volleyball, kickball, basketball.

**Faith Formation**-preschool & kindergarten (meet during Sunday 10:45 am mass), grades 1-12 (meet Sundays 9:15-10:30 am), adults (9:30-10:30 am Sundays). Designed to increase knowledge of the Catholic faith & prepare for sacraments.

**Financial Peace University**-yearly offering-13 week program with videos from Dave Ramsey-to help attain financial freedom.

**Knights of Columbus**-Catholic men's organization for men 18 & older: provides fraternal & charitable service and social opportunities for men of the parish.

**Liturgy Committee**-with the pastor formulates policy regarding sacramental prayer of the parish and planning & preparing liturgical celebrations. Also recruits, trains & coordinates liturgical ministries including: lectors, servers, ushers, and Eucharistic ministers.

**Long Range Planning Committee**-concentrates on the parish physical property & buildings and how they will meet the future needs of the parish. Looks beyond daily maintenance needs, concentrating on major renovation and/or expansion needs.

**Music Ministry**-singers and instrumentalists provide support for the liturgies of the church. All are welcome!

**Parish Council**-along with the pastor, the main policy formulating body of the parish. Makes decisions for the parish, guides, gives spiritual leadership in ministries, organizations and pastoral activities.

**Parish Life Committee**-helps with parish family & community needs with the Giving Tree at Christmas, etc.

**R.C.I.A.**-Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults-process is for people who are not Catholic but wish to inquire into the Catholic faith and for baptized Catholics who have not been confirmed or want to refresh & renew their faith.

**Respect for Life Committee**--keeps parishioners informed on life issues & encourages participation in archdiocesan events.

**Rosary**-Wednesdays at 11:30 am at Meadow Lakes Retirement Community.

**St. Thomas More Free Clinic**-operates the 1st & 3rd Saturdays at the facility across the street from St. Thomas More Church. Opportunities to serve those without insurance or underinsured in various ways.

**St. Thomas More Preschool**-St. Thomas More Preschool offers classes for children ages 2 1/2 to 5.

**St. Thomas More Women's Club**-goal of the group is to bind together the women of the parish in a common effort for the good of the church. Every woman over 18 is considered a member. Group provides mercy meals after funerals.

**St. Vincent de Paul Society**-exists to help those in need. The society works with a local food pantry, Churches in Mission, to provide food & necessities for parishioners and the community at large.

**Youth Ministry**-provides opportunities for archdiocesan retreats, youth group, activities & service for students in jr. high & high school, such as World Youth Day, National Catholic Youth Conference & more.

#### **29th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

In the scriptures, being anointed usually means you were a prophet or king of Israel. So why is Cyrus given that title? He was king of Persia when the Babylonians held the people of Israel captive. God used him to defeat them and eventually bring the Israelites back to their homes.

One thing this tells us is that God can work through anyone, not just saints and religious. Any time someone does a good deed, God is behind it. Just as God used Cyrus to free the Israelites from their Babylonian captivity, he can use governments to protect the poor, to help rebuild after disasters, or to defend freedom.

In that sense, we can understand what Jesus says about repaying to Caesar and to God. Since everything belongs to God, that should be our first allegiance. But when God works through governments, we can give some support to them, such as voting, paying taxes, or enlisting in the military. Let us ask God to work through us also, helping us to proclaim that he alone is LORD.
