Dear People of St. Thomas More,



Today I want to talk about the parish.

Our financial year runs from July 1st to June 30th. Before the beginning of each fiscal year the parish finance committee goes over the current finances and prepares the next yearly operating budget (our money plan.) The budget guides the parish spending through the year and includes all ordinary incomes and expenses.

For the fiscal year just ended, the parish had an operational loss of about \$6,000.00; most years the parish has had a small operational budget profit. Remember, we are a non-profit organization. With the nation's economic problems, the high costs of all we buy and a drop in preschool enrollment, we did not break even. We are in the red about \$6,000.00 (\$ 6,384.00), which is a little over 1% of the budget. Ordinary Sunday collections have not increased to make up the difference.

That being said, the parish's combined savings accounts have increased by \$72,000.00 (\$72,683.00) over the same yearly period of time-July 1 to June 30. This is due to people using the building fund envelopes and the Legacy of our Mission campaign that ended last January.

You have noticed that we are making changes to increase our security. 3 gates have been installed and will be painted soon-to close off the parking lot where the preschool plays. The gates will be open when the children are not playing. We have also installed cameras to record the coming and going in the building. There will be a card reading lock on the south breezeway door for the whole building. The security measures we are implementing are in response to the suggestions by the Mooresville Police Department. To achieve the level of security we need, there are several things we need to do—

- 1. Call Kathy Phillips at the office to schedule your events. She will put your activity on the parish calendar and she will have a contact person's name if something should happen.**
- 2. Kathy will give you a card to get in with.**
- 3. Don't leave doors propped open; that defeats our attempts at security.**
- 4. The current price for our security project is \$24,400.00, which will come out of the building fund.**
- 5. The Long Term Planning Committee and the Parish Council have recommended that we start part of phase II of our renovation of the parish building by planning new offices—the new offices will be next to the preschool, which is part of our response to the security suggestions, and the house will be returned to be being the residence for the pastor.**

The last thing—the staff has agreed to do the 1,000 stories before kindergarten project. We hope that the parish will support this as well...the title is from a reading program for preschools, but the staff and I are expanding it to include all ages. We live in a very complex and advanced world. The nation's money problems rise from people in high and low positions not making good decisions.

Now think of the computer development we have seen in the last 20 years...think of the developments in health care—people need far more knowledge than ever before to make good decisions. Reading is key to being intellectually prepared; as we face the 21st century, as we move from printed books to digital ones. So the staff and I are asking what books you have enjoyed—write a brief note and we'll post it in the bulletin. If you have spare books to share—bring them in and others can share them. We particularly want you to read to your children and have them read to you. Discuss what was read and what you thought about it.

To keep our place in the world, for our children to have a bright future, we need more of our children to have a good college education and be able to use it well. Reading is the way to help our kids, ourselves, and our nation meet the future—

Today we have a healthy parish—sound, with a plan, a vision. I am asking for your support—the support you have given over and over again in the past. Thank you for all you have done.

Preparing for the New Translation of the Mass New Words in Introductory Rites

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of The Roman Missal. This week, we will look more closely at some of the changes in the words and phrases that we will pray. At first some of these may seem awkward or uncomfortable, but over the course of time they will become familiar.

After the Sign of the Cross, when the priest says, "**The Lord be with you,**" our response will be "**And with your spirit.**" This response will occur at three other very important moments in the Mass (Gospel, Eucharistic Prayer, dismissal) as well, each one a time when we recognize the Holy Spirit moving in our midst.

The Gloria will be mostly familiar, but some words will be in a different order, and there will be a few small additions as well. For example, at the beginning of the Gloria, we will now pray for God's peace upon people of good will, and the invocation "we bless you" has been restored from the Latin to the litany of praise. Take some time during your daily prayer this week to help familiarize yourself with these new texts.
