Homily for July 31, 2011

Isaiah 55:1-3, Romans 8:35, 37-39, Matthew 14:13-21



Dear People of St. Thomas More,

How many times have we heard the story of the multiplication of loaves? It's the one miracle in all 4 gospels—and in Mark's gospel there is also another multiplication of loaves for the 4,000. But none of the gospel writers are wanting to give us a history lesson. The story is told to make religious messages about Jesus and God.

So what does this mean for our lives today, particularly in a violent world with the shooting and bombing in Norway—the shootings in Martinsville of the 15 year old and the 6 year old shot by his half-brother?

Jesus, in Matthew's gospel, is responding to people who have followed Him into a deserted place. He takes care of them. The gospel is telling us that in our world, at times we can find ourselves in deserted places. Jesus will respond, particularly if we are following Him.

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus is subtly being compared to Moses. Moses goes up the mountain to receive the 10 Commandments—Jesus goes up the mountain to teach His disciples the Beatitudes. Where is Jesus teaching you to find a call to violence? Nowhere—the person in Norway was first described as a fundamentalist Christian but he had never been to church—what he learned about Christianity he learned on the internet. So the use of violence is nowhere suggested in the gospels. Jesus, in Matthew's gospel, is talking about “turning the other cheek.” (Mt 5:39) The whole of the New Testament is pacifistic. So if we are open to Jesus providing as the multiplication of loaves suggests, then maybe we might seek peaceful means to respond to difficult situations.

If we look at the multiplication of loaves, we should see a quick comparison to Moses—who talked to God about the hunger of the people and God gave manna—and Jesus, who is told of the need by His apostles and gives bread.

Now think about the scene—it is peaceful—they are sitting and eating. The act of eating together is peaceful. One of the things we should think about is that 50, 20, 10 years ago, more families sat down together and ate together. They shared news of the day, maybe ideas of how things could have gone better—and the situation built up relationships and lessened violence in the family maybe.

So maybe a thought might be to increase the number of meals we share as family. Jesus, in the feeding of the 5,000, says the blessing and breaks the bread—just like he says the blessing and breaks the bread at the Last Supper. Maybe we ought to think about coming to Mass each Sunday as part of allowing Jesus to provide for us.

PREPARING FOR THE NEW TRANSLATION OF THE MASS

The Liturgy of the Word

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of *The Roman Missal*. This week, we explore the Liturgy of the Word.

We know from the Gospels that Jesus himself listened to the inspired word of God and let it shape and form him. Through the liturgy, we do the same. The readings we hear at Mass can teach us, but that is not their primary function. Rather, the scriptures are meant to reveal the Lord to us, to let us experience God's presence, and to form us in our Christian identity. In the readings proclaimed at Mass, we hear the voice of Christ himself, and we recognize the story of God acting in the past and in our own lives as well. The homily helps us to see these connections more clearly. Then through the Profession of Faith (Creed) and the Prayer of the Faithful, our response to the readings prepares us to enter into the Eucharistic Prayer that follows. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

WHY PRAY?

The "foreigners" as Isaiah calls them, the "Gentiles" as Paul calls them, or the "Canaanites" as Matthew calls them are called to worship the one true God in prayer. As we listen to today's readings, perhaps we are tempted to ask: Why pray? The question is rhetorical; it is tantamount to asking why should friends talk to one another or people in love kiss one another. Prayer is a way of relating to God, a way of talking to God. The apostles had the opportunity to talk to Jesus in the flesh. We have the opportunity to talk to Jesus Christ in prayer. Our relationship with him must be enthusiastic; it cannot be faint-hearted. John Donne, a fifteenth-century poet, knew what the qualities of good prayer were. Donne asks God to treat him differently from most Christians. The poet does not want God to merely "knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend," but also to "break, blow, burn, and make me new" (Holy Sonnets, XIV). It takes a dynamic faith on our part to come to God in prayer. As Jesus once said, "Knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). It may take pounding the door down, but if we are as persistent as the woman in today's Gospel, the results will follow.
