Homily for March 20, 2011, 2nd Sunday of Lent

**A MESSAGE
FROM YOUR PASTOR**

Dear People of St. Thomas More,

Have you journeyed very far this 1st week of Lent? Remember that the journey is a symbol of Lent for the parish.

In the first reading, God called Abram (that's what Abraham is called in this part of Genesis) "to leave home." God seems to be saying—come see the land I will give you and your descendants. Have we heard God's call this week to leave behind those destructive aspects/habits of our personal lives for a better life?

Jesus takes 3 of His disciples out to climb a mountain—They go and have a peak experience, a high—Jesus was glorified right there on the top of the mountain; with Him were Moses and Elijah. Moses symbolizes the Law—think 10 commandments and all that. Elijah symbolizes all the Prophets. To see Jesus' glory—you need integrity—you have to live a higher morality. Our words and actions must not only match but be noble. Great character is shown by great words matching actions.

Jesus is also preparing His disciples for His suffering and crucifixion. The Transfiguration is a high point before the journey into the depths. So how has your journey been this week? Has it prepared you for troubles that we almost never see coming yet are always in life?

Maybe another way of thinking about Lent is as a way to gain understanding. Ever notice that we have 2 eyes and 2 ears but one mouth? God did that for a reason. The eyes and ears are organs that enable us to understand—the mouth helps us to be understood. Lent might be the exercise of seeking understanding. In the "7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens" (that we are going to have a book discussion on in April) one of the habits is seeking to understand. God led Abraham to a greater understanding of God and Life. Jesus led the apostles, Peter, John and James, to a greater understanding. To understand takes effort—to climb a mountain, even a small one, takes effort. But if we seek understanding—we can come to another habit of successful teens—creating a win—win situation. We need to create a situation where I win/benefit and you win/benefit. This is a level of care/concern—a type of love. It is the opposite of I win/you lose propositions. This is often the description of being used/manipulated, a description of war, of oppression of people under a dictator like in Libya.

Last thing. Jesus, in His suffering and death, demonstrates another situation—I lose/you win. He accepts the cross for us—this I lose/you win can be sacrificial. In the gospel of John there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. Infrequently, maybe rarely—we are called to be sacrificial—I lose/you win. Again in the gospel of John, Jesus tells us to love one another as I have loved you; faith in the Resurrection tells us that God will turn this into a win/win situation.

Fourth Sunday Of Lent See the Light

Poor blind man. He didn't even ask to be cured. And look how much trouble it caused; he got more than he bargained for. Yet because of his experience he truly did get more than he expected; he received the gift of faith.

Blindness in the gospels is usually a symbol for unbelief and sin. So when the man begins to see physically, he also begins to see the light of faith. Notice how he labels Jesus: First as just a man, then as a prophet, next as a man from God, and finally as Lord. Each time he is questioned, his faith in Jesus grows.

It's been said that if you want to understand something better, explain it to someone else. As we express our faith, we strengthen it in ourselves. The blind man found that the more he talked about Jesus, the more he believed in him. We can experience the same thing when we talk about our faith in Jesus. We might be teaching our children the true meaning of Easter. We may be answering questions of a non-catholic friend. We may be talking to a neighbor who has been away from church for many years. Any time we talk about our faith in the Lord, it gets stronger.

In the Gospel, we see the blind man being questioned repeatedly. The Pharisees harass him and eventually throw him out of the Temple. But the man was not discouraged. So, too, we should not be discouraged when we are ridiculed for our faith. If we hold on to our faith in times of stress or difficulty, we will find that the Lord has been with us and that we are stronger for it.

Since Jesus is the Light of the world, that light shines in all believers. Those preparing for Baptism at Easter are beginning to see that light in their lives. We pray that they can let go of any blindness in their hearts to receive the light of Christ.
